## Future Ready Oregon Round 1 Grant Awards

### *Large Grants*

#### **Chemeketa Community College**

Chemeketa Community College will expand their existing Pre-Apprenticeship programs within the Willamette Workforce Partnership region (Linn, Marion, Polk, and Yamhill Counties). The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, and incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. Grant award includes funding for support services for student tools, tuition waivers and meals. **Award Amount: \$264,451.**

#### **Klamath Community College**

Klamath Community College will recruit, train, and facilitate high school student participation in Pre-Apprenticeship Construction activities, courses, and/or supported employer placements within the East Cascades Workforce Region (Crook, Deschutes, Gilliam, Hood River, Jefferson, Klamath, Lake, Sherman, Wasco, and Wheeler Counties). Grant award includes funding for support services for student materials, tools, tuition, and technology supports. The programs will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, persons with disabilities, members of Oregon's nine federally recognized tribes, individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination in employment based on age, individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$139,240.**

#### **Oregon Department of Corrections**

The Department of Corrections will create a new Boiler Operator Registered Apprenticeship Program within the Northwest Oregon Works (Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln, and Tillamook Counties), Willamette Workforce Partnership (Linn, Marion, Polk, and Yamhill Counties), and Lane Workforce Partnerships (Lane County) regions. The program will serve incarcerated individuals from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, individuals with disabilities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, members of Oregon's nine federally recognized Indigenous tribes, individuals facing age discrimination, and LGBTQ+ individuals. **Award Amount: \$30,507.**

#### **Portland Youth Builders**

Portland Youth Builders will expand outreach and enrollment for its Construction Pre-Apprenticeship Program and train additional apprenticeship-ready graduates within the Clackamas Workforce Partnership (Clackamas County) and Worksystems (Multnomah and Washington Counties) regions. The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, and LGBTQ+ individuals. Students will be. **Award Amount: \$144,473.**





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### **Rogue Community College**

Rogue Community College will develop a new Industrial Machinist Apprenticeship Program within the manufacturing industry. The program will serve students within the Rogue Workforce region (Jackson and Josephine Counties), in partnership with Erickson Air Crane and Met One. Grant award includes funding for support services for student transportation and supplies. The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: low-income communities, women, veterans, and incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$249,751.**

### **Southwestern Oregon Community College**

Southwestern Oregon Community College will develop Pre-Apprenticeship Programs in the Construction industry for high school students in the Southwestern Oregon Workforce Investment Board region (Coos, Curry, and Douglas Counties). The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, and rural and frontier communities. **Award Amount: \$432,250.**

### **United We Heal**

United We Heal will expand its Certified Drug and Alcohol Counselor (CDAC) Registered Apprenticeship Program to the following nine workforce regions: Northwest Oregon Works (Benton, Clatsop, Columbia, Lincoln, and Tillamook Counties), Willamette Workforce Partnership (Linn, Marion, Polk, and Yamhill Counties), Lane Workforce Partnership (Lane County), and East Cascade Works (Crook, Deschutes, Gilliam, Hood River, Jefferson, Klamath, Lake, Sherman, Wasco, and Wheeler Counties) regions. Grant application includes support services for student technology supports and childcare. The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, and individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$233,000.**

### **Youth 71five Ministries**

Youth71five Ministries will create a new Pre-Apprenticeship Program in Construction for youth within the Rogue Workforce Partnership (Jackson and Josephine Counties) region. The program will serve students from the following Priority Populations: communities of color, women, low-income communities, rural and frontier communities, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals, individuals who disproportionately experience discrimination in employment based on age, and those individuals who identify as members of the LGBTQ+ community. **Award Amount: \$92,296.**





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## Small Grants

### Pacific Northwest Ironworkers

Pacific Northwest Ironworkers will conduct preliminary research and development to create an Ironworker Pre-Apprenticeship program at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility located in Wilsonville, OR (Clackamas Workforce Partnership region). The program will serve priority populations including women, communities of color, and incarcerated and formerly incarcerated individuals. **Award Amount: \$10,000.**

### Latino Built

Latino Built will conduct research and development to identify and address barriers to enrollment for the Latinx community in Oregon’s Construction Apprenticeship Programs with the goal of increasing Latinx participation and overall success in construction apprenticeships. This program will serve priority populations including communities of color and low-income communities. **Award Amount: \$10,000.**
