BCC FIREARMS QUALIFICATION & REMEDIATION

The Pistol Qualification Course 1 (PQC1) is a 25-round course with timed stages. BCC students must qualify at least once in the PQC1 for certification. For a qualifying score, all 25 rounds must be on DPSST target in the 3- or 5-point scoring zones. Students are provided three separate firearms sequences in order to qualify in the PQC1 and pass BCC Firearms.

Firearms Qualification and Remediation Sequence:

Attend an initial 3-Day Basic Firearms Class (Basic Firearms Glock - #1), which includes three PQC1 qualifications attempts.

If a student is deficient in the PQC1 at the end of the initial 3-Day Basic Firearms Class, the student may select one of the following three options:

- 1. Attend a voluntary remediation.
 - A. Student(s) attending voluntary remediation will be provided three hours (maximum) of firearms training and two PQC1 qualification attempts.
 - B. Voluntary remediation shall be scheduled no more than five calendar days after completion of initial training.
 - C. If the student fails to achieve a passing score during remediation, they will be scheduled for the next available 3-day Basic Firearms Class.
- 2. 'Challenge' the firearms PQC1.
 - A. Student is provided the opportunity to qualify on the PQC1 with one cold attempt; no training or warm-up will be provided prior to that qualification attempt.
 - B. If student is deficient after the cold qualification attempt; student may be permitted to attend a voluntary remediation as described in subsection (1) above or be assigned to the next available Basic Firearms Class.
- 3. Begin second firearms sequence by attending the next available 3-Day Basic Firearms Class (Basic Firearms Glock # 2).

If the student is still deficient after a full second sequence, the sequence may be repeated a third and final time.

If, after 3 full sequences, the student has not achieved a passing score on the PQC1, the student will be dismissed from the Basic Corrections Course.

In each separate firearms qualification sequence, a BCC student would potentially have up to six PQC1 attempts available. If a student attended all three firearm sequences, they would potentially have 18 PQC1 attempts available to pass the PQC1. Students are remediated and do not 'fail' the BCC Firearms Class until all three sequences have been provided and completed.
