On October 12, 2021, the Oregon State Land Board directed its administrative agency, the Oregon Department of State Lands to examine the potential future sale of the property. The parcel is classified as New Land, formerly submerged land that was newly created with fill after 1963.

In addition to public comment, numerous studies will be undertaken such as survey, archaeological impacts and appraisal.

Once the public comment period has ended and reports from the studies have been received, the Department will make a recommendation to the State Land Board on whether to sell the parcel. The State Land Board, comprised of the Governor, Secretary of State and the State Treasurer, will then decide to sell the parcel or not.
