STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Council appoint the Linn County Board of Commissioners as the Special Advisory Group for proceedings related to the proposed Muddy Creek Energy Park.

BACKGROUND

On May 19, 2023, the Oregon Department of Energy (Department) received a Notice of Intent to File an Application for a Site Certificate for the Muddy Creek Energy Park (Proposed Facility). The NOI was submitted by Muddy Creek Energy Park, LLC.¹

The proposed 199 MW solar PV facility would be located on 1,588 acres (2.5 square miles) of private land in unincorporated Linn County and is anticipated to consist of the following:

IDENTIFICATION OF SPECIAL ADVISORY GROUPS

ORS 469.480(1) requires the Council to designate the governing body of any local government within whose jurisdiction a facility is proposed to be located as a Special Advisory Group. The proposed site boundary is located entirely within the jurisdiction of Linn County. On June 7, 2023, the Department sent a letter notifying the Linn County Board of Commissioners that they would be designated as a Special Advisory Group in accordance with ORS 469.480(1).

Pursuant to ORS 469.504, the purpose of a Special Advisory Group is to recommend applicable substantive criteria from the affected local government's acknowledged comprehensive plan and land use regulations that are required by the statewide planning goals and in effect on the date the application is submitted.

RECOMMENDED COUNCIL ACTION

Pursuant to ORS 469.480(1), staff recommends the Council appoint the Linn County Board of Commissioners as a Special Advisory Groups for any proceedings before the Council related to the proposed facility.
