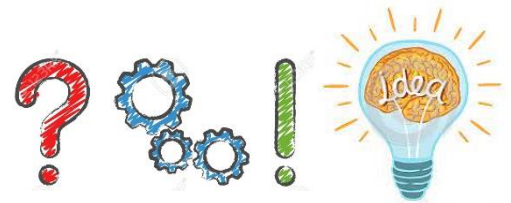

## Poster Design Contest

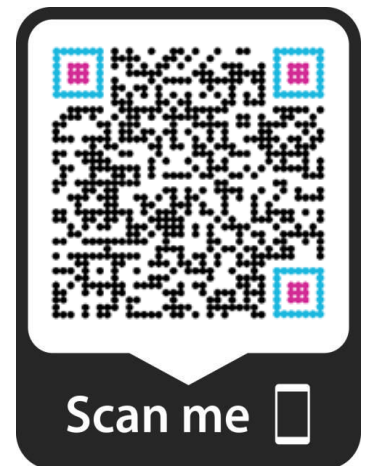


### Here's how to participate:

Every state and territory in the United States has a Center for the Book library to promote an awareness of books, authors, reading, literacy, and to highlight the literary heritage of their region. Our library was specifically chosen to promote representation for people with disabilities. How cool is that?

The winner's poster will be used by our graphic design team as inspiration for our new Center for the Book logo and will receive a \$100 Amazon gift card. ## FUN WINTER READS!

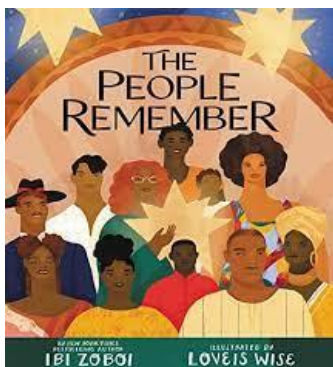
### Red and Green and Blue and White

**The People Remember** by Ibi Aanu Zobi. **DB105456**. The author recounts the journey of African descendants in



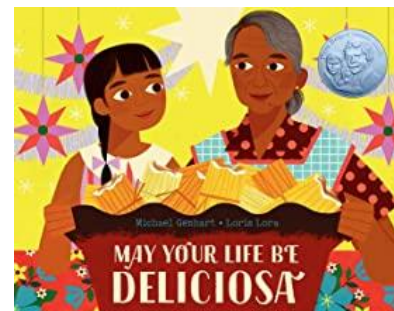
America by connecting their history to the seven principles of Kwanzaa. Coretta Scott-King Award Honor. For grades K-3. 2021.

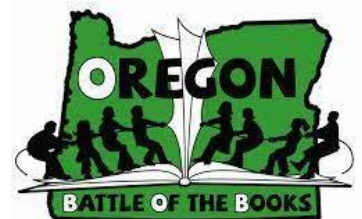
