
## **Conservation Strategy**

- Defines what the HCP is trying to accomplish through biological goals and objectives
- Includes conservation actions that will be implemented to achieve the objectives
- Describes how the applicant will track progress through a monitoring program
- Determines how the applicant will adjust implementation of the HCP through adaptive management




# **Biological Goals**

- Broadly describe the desired future conditions of an HCP in succinct statements
- Must be sufficiently specific to guide the conservation strategy during implementation of the HCP
- Goals are <u>needed for each species</u>, but in some cases species can be grouped together




# **Biological Objectives**

- The incremental steps taken to achieve a biological goal; often multiple objective support each goal
- Strive to make objectives specific and measureable
- The measuring stick for how the HCP performs and thus directly influence the monitoring program




#### **Conservation Action**

- Activity implemented "on the ground" that contributes to the biological objective
- Multiple conservation actions are needed to achieve an objective
- Conservation actions can contribute to more than one objective
- Includes operational practices and conservation practices that minimize and mitigate impacts on covered species




# Conceptual Biological Goals and Objectives

- Currently working on conceptual biological goals and objectives
- This allows us to get feedback from the Scoping Team on the concepts needed to address covered species needs
- Conceptual biological goals and objectives do not yet include any quantifiable targets
- Briefing the Steering Committee on the conceptual goals and objectives on August 29<sup>th</sup>



# Stakeholder and County Engagement

- Meeting open to the public Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>: conceptual biological goals and objectives
- Following meetings will include discussion about conservation actions
- Engaging stakeholders1:1 and preparing for potential smaller group conversations.
- Working to develop a path with Counties beyond FTLAC meetings.



## **Business Case Comparison**

- Expanding the business case to evaluate economic, social, and biological outcomes
- Analysis will compare
  - Current FMP (Take Avoidance)
  - Revised FMP (Take Avoidance)
  - HCP
- Working with the FTLAC and BOF to better define parameters that will be evaluated
- Will execute the comparison as the FMP Revision and HCP get further along
