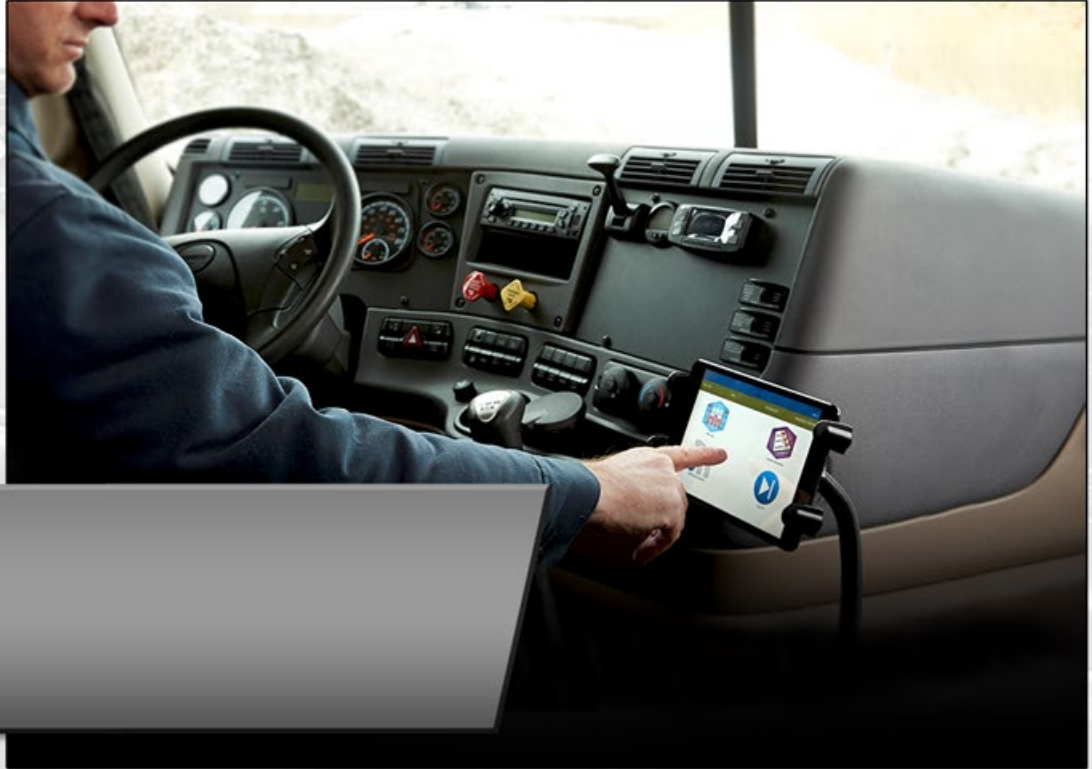

Exemptions

- Adverse driving conditions
- Driver-salesperson
- Oilfield operations
- Pipeline welding trucks
- Retail store deliveries



North American Standard (NAS) - A Hours of Service (HOS) and eRODS



Exemptions (cont.)

- Travel time
- Ground water, construction materials, & equipment
- Short haul operations
- Utility service vehicle
- 16-hour exception



North American Standard (NAS) - A Hours of Service (HOS) and eRODS



Exemptions (cont.)

Agricultural Commodities:

- Defined as: non processed food, feed, fiber or livestock (395.2)
- All time spent within a 150 air mile radius of the source is exempt from Part 395



North American Standard (NAS) - A Hours of Service (HOS) and eRODS



Exemptions (cont.)

Farm Supplies:

- Defined as products directly related to the growing or harvesting of agricultural commodities (395.2)
- From wholesale or retail distribution point to a farm or other location for intended use
- From a wholesale distribution point to a retail distribution point
- All time spent within a 150 air mile radius of the distribution point is exempt from Part 395



North American Standard (NAS) - A Hours of Service (HOS) and eRODS



Exemptions (cont.) 395.1(k) Agricultural Commodities to Market

When the driver exceeds the 150 air mile radius of the source or distribution point, the calculation of all hours of service rules begin (e.g. he will then have 11 hours to drive within a 14 hour period.)
