Josephine Co. Transit Station Phase I


Total Projected Cost: \$589,000

Construction Schedule: 2020

Overview: This project will construct Phase I of a new, safer transfer site for current and future Grants Pass and Josephine County transit operations.



Problem: The Josephine Community Transit sees record ridership on its routes. As such, riders cannot be safely accommodated with its current downtown transfer station on 6th Street in front of the Anne Basker Auditorium. The site, between the courthouse and city hall, is typically crowded with buses; buses are delayed re-entering traffic. Two



crosswalks also intersect the bus loading area, posing a risk for pedestrians.

Project Description: Phase I would build a transit transfer center on 5th Street, between E and D Streets. The two lots owned by Josephine County would be donated for an in-kind match. Bus parking would be on the perimeter with pullouts created on 5th, D and E Streets. Six loading areas

would be created, one for each route.

Phase II, if matching funds can be found, would built a customer service facility, driver break room and employee rest room. It would be paid for as funds become available. The project has utility and functions with only one completed phase. The facility will accommodate existing transit service as well as future expansions.
