 - ► High vehicle demand, low parking supply


Timed Use Permit Goals

- ► Improve Safety at Exit 31
- ► Reduce congestion on I-84 and within the lot
- ► Reduce backups on the Historic Highway


Permit Details

- Multnomah Falls (I-84) Timed Use permits
 - ▶ 120-80 available/hour online 9 am 6 pm
 - ▶ 870 available per day (40 less per day than last year)
 - ▶ 50 permits per day in-person (Split evenly between Gateway to the Gorge Visitor Center and Cascade Locks Historical Museum)
 - > 77,764 permits issued via rec.gov
 - ▶ 138 in-person from Cascade Locks
 - ▶ 415 in-person from Troutdale


Average Permits by Day




Average Permits by Hour

In-person permits Average by Day




Preliminary Traffic Results - Volumes on the Historic Highway




Pedestrian Volumes at Multnomah Falls



Hourly Bicyclists at Multnomah Falls






What to do about bike parking?



Historic Highway Multnomah Falls Lot Changes

- Reconfigured one-way lot to enter on the west side and exit near the crosswalk
- Sasquatch Shuttle is operating lot added staff person to close lot when full
 - Gathered average cars per hour data
 - Also staffed the crosswalk attendant
