

OTHER COUNCIL ENGAGEMENTS

- LGEMAC Local Government Emergency Management Advisory Council:
 - Section 152 of <u>House Bill 2927</u>, ordered by the Senate on June 25, 2021, established the LGEMAC. The Council provides advice and recommendations to Oregon Department of Emergency Management regarding emergency preparedness and response functions.
- OSSPAC Oregon Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission
 - OSSPAC formed from Senate Bill 96 in 1991. The <u>mission</u> of OSSPAC is to positively influence decisions and policies regarding predisaster mitigation of earthquake and tsunami hazards, increase public understanding of earthquake hazard, risk, exposure, and vulnerability through education, and be responsive to the new studies and/or issues raised around earthquakes and tsunamis.
- OHSC Oregon Homeland Security Council
 - OHSC was created by <u>House Bill 2101</u> in the 2005 legislation session. Placed within the Oregon Department of Emergency
 Management, this council receives briefings on security matters for which the department is responsible at least annually from state
 agencies and organizations as determined by the council. The council also advises state agencies with responsibility for security matters
 on the future direction of the department's planning, preparedness, response, and recovery activities.

- 2023 April Finalized Bylaws, developed process for tracking, analyzing areas of interest for consideration of formal recommendation to Homeland Security Council/Governor Kotek
- 2023 January/September Holding pattern awaiting State Resilience Officer and Department of Emergency Management leadership appointments
- 2023 September Next Steps:
 - Begin prioritization of areas of interest and assessment of plan for improvement considerations from prior audits and after-action reports
 - Establish pathway for engagement with emergency management cooperators, members of the public, state agencies and other council/committees
