



 - 0 hr to Day 4
- Primitive EOC Field Operations & Amateur Radio
- Auxiliary Communications County to State

2022:

- Start at Scenario Day 5
- Focus on "Catastrophic" Local Government Response
- Expanded EOC Field Operations
- Integrated Auxiliary
 Communications City-Co-Tribal State







Exercise Highlights

- Auxiliary Communications and CERT Initial Damage Assessment
 - 4 CERT Chapters Lincoln Co
 - Auxiliary Communications relay of field information to local (County) EOC's
 - New Rapid Needs Assessment
 Form

- EOC Field Operations Open House
 - Opportunity to view grant funded emergency response equipment, supplies
 - Opportunity to meet and hear about public safety volunteer groups
 - Opportunity to identify gaps in catastrophic needs for response



 - Finalization of Initial Priority Clearance Routes
 - Finalization of Pre-Fuel Prioritization Resource Orders
 - Continue Auxiliary Communications Expansion
- 2023 Cascadia Rising Focus Areas
 - Mass Care and Sheltering
 - Medical First Aid Stations
 - Hospital Surge Catastrophic Support
 - Participate with State/Federal Coordination

Expansion of Catastrophic Go Kits

Local Government Go Kits focus on

- Agency line of succession plan
- Emergency contact information (amateur radio/sat phones/other)
- Guide how to utilize Amateur Radio Operators to relay messages
- Catastrophic Emergency Declaration specific to Cascadia event, prefilled
- Initial response checklist/guide restoration of Community Lifelines
- ICS 201 Initial briefing form and immediate response checklist/guide
- ICS 202 Response objectives for (1-7 days, 7-14, 14-28, Month 2, Month 3 specific to Cascadia response)
- Resource Requests for Fuel, Food, Water Purification, Medications, Medical Personnel
 prefilled
- Community situational assessment guide utilizing rapid needs assessment forms/processes
- Downtime –no technology resources printed maps, forms prefilled
