Crook	1. Pass an ordinance requiring the posting of Quitline information in retail stores.
Deschutes	1. Gain support to implement a tobacco retail license which will include <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Licensing incentive program, b. Restricting retailers from selling tobacco within 1000 feet of schools, c. Banning the sale of flavored tobacco, and d. Raising the minimum legal sale age to 21 in Deschutes County's incorporated and unincorporated areas.
Klamath	1. Implement comprehensive tobacco retail licensing, including point of sale strategies and youth and retailer engagement.
Lane	1. Expand the tobacco retail license ordinance currently covering unincorporated areas to include several incorporated cities across Lane County. 2. Raise the minimum legal sale age of tobacco to 21.
Marion	1. Adopt and establish a tobacco retail licensing system with an adequate licensing fee in at least one jurisdiction.
Multnomah	1. Prohibit new tobacco and nicotine retailers within 1000 feet of public and private K-12 schools. 2. Raise the minimum legal sale age for tobacco and nicotine products to 21.
Umatilla	1. Establish a tobacco retail licensing system across multiple jurisdictions with adequate licensing fee that restricts location of new tobacco retail outlets within 1000 feet of a school or youth location. 2. Eliminate the sale of tobacco products in pharmacies.
