Pursuant to a duly adopted delegation order, and acting in accordance therewith, the Director, or her designee, has approved the following actions on behalf of the Oregon Parks & Recreation Commission:

SCENIC WATERWAYS NOTIFICATION

On March 3, 2023, Notification of Intent 9-423-23 was approved to allow a stream restoration project, and illegal infrastructure removal on the Upper Clackamas State Scenic Waterway. The project is located at 45° 1'16.52" North 122° 0'35.31" West, and on the Upper Clackamas River at Austin Hot Springs. The project was approved because it complies with all relevant Upper Clackamas Scenic Waterway rules, and does not impede the scenic values of the river in this section. Illegal infrastructure is being removed from the State Scenic Waterway, followed by stream restoration to enhance Salmon and Steelhead habitat.

On March 3, 2023, Notification of Intent 9-424-23 was approved to allow a stream restoration project in the Upper Clackamas State Scenic Waterway. The project is located at 44°54'19.75 North 121°53'35.39" West, and at the confluence of Cub Creek and the Upper Clackamas River. The project was approved because it complies with all relevant Upper Clackamas Scenic Waterway rules, and does not impede the scenic values of the river in this section. No man-made structures are required, this project is designed to enhance Salmon and Steelhead habitat.

On March 27, 2023, Notification of Intent 21-1-23 was approved to allow a 25-acre timber harvest in the Molalla River Scenic Waterway. The selective harvest is located in T6S, R3E, Sec. 06, Tax Lot 501. The project was approved because it does not impact the scenic value of the river due to being a selective harvest prescription and is compliant with all Molalla River State Scenic waterway rules.

On March 2, 2023, Notification of Intent (NOI 07-741-23) was approved to allow the Oregon Department of Forestry to conduct post-fire timber salvage operations on the Maple Gulch parcel owned by the Department of State Lands in the Lower Rogue River State Scenic Waterway, near the community of Galice in Josephine County. This area burned during the Rum Creek wildfire

in August 2022. The project was approved because the proposed activities comply with all relevant Lower Rogue River State Scenic Waterway rules, specifically those related to timber harvesting following wildlife.

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On December 22, 2022, Notification of Intent NOI 07-733-22 was approved to allow the property owner to install temporary structures lost to the 2021 wildfires at the Galice Resort, 11744 Galice Road, Merlin, in the River Community Area of the Lower Rogue State Scenic Waterway. Replacement of structures lost due to natural disasters is permissible under the State Scenic Waterway rules, provided the structure is in the same footprint and meets the other requirements as described in rule

On April 12, 2023, Notification of Intent 2B-1107-23 was approved to allow for a new detached duplex and the replacement of an existing single-family home at 19500 Pine Drive, Bend, in the River Community Area of the Upper Deschutes State Scenic Waterway. This NOI was approved because proposed work is outside of 100' setback, below height limit, finished in materials and colors that blend in with surrounding environment, maintains existing vegetation screening on site, and will add screening vegetation. Complies with all relevant Upper Deschutes River Community Area rules.

On March 15, 2023, Notification of Intent 4-213-23 was approved to allow the property owner to build three new dwellings, one new barn, and one outhouse in rural Wasco County at Township 6S-Range 19E-Section 29-Tax Lot 400 adjacent to the John Day River State Scenic Waterway. This NOI was approved because the building materials and colors follow requirements for structures that fall within the State Scenic Waterway setbacks. The land owner will also be planting trees and shrubs for added screening of the structures.

On May 4, 2023, Notification of Intent 4-214-23 was approved to allow for renovation work on trails and vaulted toilets at Priest Hole Recreation Site on BLM land in Wheeler County. This NOI was approved because the work was all for renovations and upgrades to existing infrastructure. It complies with all of the rules governing the John Day River Scenic Waterway.

OCEAN SHORES ALTERATION DECISIONS

On March 30, 2023 three permits (3032-22, 3033-22 and 3034-22) were issued to construct 450 feet of new riprap revetment along the ocean shore adjacent to 324 Worldmark Drive in Gleneden Beach.

On May 2, 2023 permit 3031-23 was issued for rebuilding an existing 72-foot long, 2-foot wide, boardwalk located in a narrow community right-of-way located at the northern terminus of Oceania Drive in Waldport.

On May 3, 2023 permit 3036-22 was issued to install the Bifrost Submarine Fiber Optic Cable System via horizontal directional drilling across the ocean shore at a depth of between 20 and 80 feet. The crossing will occur on and adjacent to 5195 Winema Rd in Cloverdale.

On May 5, 2022 two permits (3037-22 and 3038-22) were issued to construct 105 feet of riprap revetment along the ocean shore adjacent to 145 Salishan Drive in the Salishan development. The revetment replaces a structure built in the 1970s.
