Visiting Information

Eastern Oregon Youth Correctional Facility



Visits are an important way for the youth in our custody to stay connected with family. This guide will help you know the rules so that you can visit safely, comfortably, and without disruption.

Request to be on your youth's OYA Approved Visitor List:



Please turn in the form at least two weeks **before** you visit, so that we have time to process your request.

OYA uses the information on your form to do a criminal **background check.** If you have an arrest or conviction, it does not always mean you cannot come into the facility — it depends on your situation. If you have an active warrant, we will not let you inside.

If you are approved, we will put you on your youth's OYA **Approved Visitor List.** We cannot let anyone visit who is not on this list. Check with your youth's case coordinator to see if you have been approved.

If you're already on your youth's OYA Approved Visitor List:

Once you are approved, you are ready to schedule a visit!

When is visiting time?

Saturdays 1-4 p.m.

Sundays 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

Visits must be scheduled at least 24 hours in advance. To schedule a visit, call 541-573-3133.

Who is allowed to visit?

Typically, family members and other **supportive people** may visit once they are approved.

Children younger than 18 may visit with **approval.** If applicable, youth in our custody must take a polygraph test, may

need to go through the victim clarification process, and must have the approval of their treatment team before they are allowed to have visits with minors. If you're not sure whether this rule applies to your youth, please ask their living unit manager. Minors who visit must be supervised by a parent or guardian who is 18 or older.

Are any youth not able to have visits?

If your youth is in medical isolation with COVID, they may not have visits. They may also be restricted from visits if their living unit is having a COVID-19 outbreak.

Check with your youth's case coordinator for more information.

What happens at visitation?

FIRST: Check in.



Check in at the visitation entrance. All visitors age 13 and older must show a photo ID.

Wash your hands, check for COVID symptoms, and take your temperature. If you have symptoms of illness (cough, fever, muscle pain, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell), we cannot let you inside.

SECOND: Enjoy your visit!

Most visits happen in Eastern's visiting room. Visitors and youth sit together at tables.

We have games available for you to play with your youth during the visit.

Once you are inside the visiting area, please stay there until the end of your visit. If you do have to go outside for any reason, you will have to clear the metal detector again before coming back in.

Important things to remember:

Please review our clothing rules inside this brochure to make sure your clothing is appropriate before you arrive. This will save you time at check-in and allow you to start your visit quicker.

Be respectful to staff, youth, and other visitors. This includes following staff directions, using appropriate language, and not talking with other youth or families, other than a casual greeting. We work hard to create a positive, family-friendly environment at visitation. We want everyone to feel that they are safe, their privacy is respected, and they can enjoy their visit without disruptions.

Please limit physical contact with your youth to a short embrace at the beginning and end of the visit. Again, this is to make sure visiting is a positive, family-friendly experience for everyone.



You will have to clear a metal detector before going inside. This is to make sure that you, your youth, and everyone inside is safe. If you are not able to clear the metal detector, you will not be allowed to visit.

NOTE: You may be required to wear a face **covering.** If face coverings are required on the day you visit, we will not be able to let you inside without one. This is to protect all youth living inside from getting COVID-19.

What to bring, what not to bring, and what to wear



You may bring these items inside our facility:





Mask/face covering



Money for your youth's account: At visiting, you may only give this to staff, not to your youth. We accept cash, checks, or money orders. You also may mail money to your youth. We do not recommend mailing cash. Checks or money orders should be made out to Oregon Youth Authority with your youth's name in the memo line.



Basic items for an infant: one diaper, wipes, one empty plastic baby bottle, and a small amount of formula or sealed baby food. No glass containers.

> Nursing mothers: talk with visitation staff about options.



You may NOT bring these items inside our facility: They can cause safety and security issues, and they can potentially harm a youth's treatment.



Weapons or potential weapons



Tobacco. marijuana, and vaping products (not allowed anywhere on the facility grounds)

Prescription drugs, unless they are lifesustaining



Cameras or audio/video recorders





Illegal drugs or paraphernalia

Current photo ID Cell phones, watch phones, and other (required if you are devices that connect 13 or older) to the internet




Vehicle key and remote

Wallets and purses

Life-sustaining medicine for vourself, such as an inhaler (must be in original container or box with prescription label)









Bras with an underwire (these may set off the metal detector)

Short shorts





Clothing that is torn in inappropriate places

Sheer, transparent, or mesh fabric (other than hosiery)

Important!

It is a Class C felony to provide contraband items to youth in custody or to bring those items into an OYA facility without authorization. (ORS 162.185)

- You are subject to a search at any time when you are inside our facility.
- You may not give anything to youth during your visit without staff permission.
- If you do not follow the rules about what you may wear, or you try to bring in items that are not allowed, we will not let you into the facility.

Short skirts

Spaghetti strap shirts, tube tops, or any shirts that are too revealing

Fanny packs, money belts, or belts with compartments



Messages that promote drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, pornography, nudity, gangs, or prejudice, or are demeaning to others

Why are there so many rules?

We want to make sure that you, your young person, our staff, and all the youth in our facility are **safe.** We are trying to create a positive, family-friendly environment at visitation. These rules help us keep everyone safe while allowing you to have your visit without disruption.
