



### NPDES Permits (2,910)








#### **Budget Comparison**

### Overview of proposed changes

- 3% proposed increase to water quality fees for fiscal year
   2022 on most water quality permit fees
- Rule language clarification
- Fee table clarifications



### Overview of proposed changes

#### Clarification

DEQ proposes the following clarification to the fee language OAR 340-045-0070 to clarify all 700-PM fees are non-refundable unless a permit cannot be assigned.

Proposed clarification: "...The permittee must submit the applicable fees with the permit application. The <u>new permit application</u> fee, <u>annual fee and 5-year renewal fee are</u> non-refundable unless DEQ or DEQ's agent determines that the permittee cannot be assigned to the general permit...."

OAR 340-045-0075

#### Table 70F

 Clarity around biosolids management plan and recycled water use plan fees

#### Table 70G

- Adding 2000J and 2300A NPDES general permits to the table
- Adding 700-PM NPDES general permit renewal fee every five years (in addition to the annual fee) only for motorized suction dredges
