



## **House Bill 3220: Modernizing Oregon E-Cycles**

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## Why Modernize?

In July 2022, the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality began a series of workshops to get public input to improve the popular Oregon E-Cycles program and sustain its success for years to come. Since 2009, Oregon E-Cycles has collected over 268 million pounds of electronic devices for recycling, preventing toxins from entering Oregon landfills and recovering precious and rare earth metals for new electronics. Last year, an instability in the program's services caused a re-evaluation of the system's structure.

The content of the original legislative concept developed last fall and presented in the workshops has been introduced in <u>House Bill 3220</u>. DEQ will seek an amendment to HB 3220 that reflects input from workshop participants, in the final workshops. Below is a summary of the changes in the amendment being sought.

Equity, convenience standard, public awareness	<ul> <li>Include equity considerations by requiring:         <ul> <li>Program plan must describe how the electronics producer responsibility organization will provide convenient service and equitable service throughout the state, including to rural areas and minority, lower-income and other historically underserved populations</li> <li>An electronics producer responsibility organization must engage with and work to sustain high awareness of the program in minority, lower-income, rural, and other historically underserved communities</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Convenience standard	<ul> <li>Allow counties time to adjust to changes in levels of collection sites required by new convenience standard:         <ul> <li>DEQ may waive required number of collection sites with respect to a county or city if the proposed plan provides adequate or substantively equivalent collection convenience.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Goals	<ul> <li>Change goal requirements as follows:         <ul> <li>An electronics producer responsibility organization must establish and work to achieve collection goals and goals for maintaining high public awareness</li> <li>If a program goal was not met in a previous year, an electronics producer responsibility organization must describe, with supporting data, what changes or steps program will undertake to ensure goals are achieved in upcoming year</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Reuse, Collection Sites	Remove requirement to establish reuse goals. Ensure reuse opportunities as follows:  • An electronics producer responsibility organization must coordinate activities with recycling and reuse programs, including nonprofit organizations that refurbish technology, to further the environmentally sound management of recycling of electronics.  • A collection site may recover collected covered electronic devices for refurbishment and resale at retail. An electronics producer responsibility organization may require the collection site to exclude the weight of record devices for purposes of annual reports and compensation,
Collection sites	Require fair compensation to collection sites calculated to cover costs to collect, store, manage, and transport covered electronic devices.
Collection sites	Allow DEQ-permitted transfer stations, landfills and material recovery facilities to opt-in as collection sites, if willing.
Program administration, PRO tasks	Remove requirement for an electronics producer responsibility organization to conduct sampling
Program administration, PRO tasks, collection sites	Before removing a collection site from its network, an electronics producer responsibility organization must work with other electronics producer responsibility organizations or the coordinating body to determine if the collection site can be added to another electronics producer responsibility organization's network.

	If the collection site will not be part of any network, the electronics producer responsibility organization must provide 90-day notice prior to collection site removal to:  • DEQ;  • Other collection sites in the same wasteshed; and  • The public, via the program website
	DEQ may require an electronics producer responsibility organization to retain a collection site if notice is not provided, unless the electronics producer responsibility organization has good cause for not providing notice.
Public awareness	An electronics producer responsibility organization or coordinating body shall consult with DEQ on public awareness.
Public awareness	Remove requirement for universal branding among multiple electronics producer responsibility programs
Anti-Trust	Add language to address anti-trust concerns.
Transitional Provisions	Keep system on calendar year; effective date of E-Cycles law changes will be January 1, 2026 instead of July 1, 2025.
	<ul> <li>Other transition-related changes:</li> <li>DEQ will make one final collections determination for 2024; the same collections determination will apply for 2025.</li> <li>The state contractor program and any manufacturer program for 2024 and 2025 must reconcile recycling credits by December 31, 2026.</li> </ul>
