Proposed Rule Overview

 Proposed rules protect existing uses, salmonid populations, and other aquatic life

 Use best available scientific information to more accurately designate uses

 Increases protection in waters where current uses were not correctly identified or sufficient

Added Items Since RAC #4

- 31 of NPDES permitted facilities are POTWs
 - Facility needs are each unique and site specific, unknown costs
 - If more stringent limits, treatment options and current facility operations may need to change
 - If less stringent limits, cost savings are possible
- 3 large businesses which may be impacted by temp rule
- 1 small business which may be impacted by temp rule



Addressed all comments in FIS

 Incorporated comments that were within the scope of fiscal impacts

 Additional comments were either incorporated or responded to in the document

Overall Effects

- Possible positive and/or negative effects, costs largely unknown
- Updates to the subcategories will result in more stringent AND less stringent criteria
 - Most waters will not change designations
- ~ 43 NPDES-permitted facilities may be directly affected by criteria
 - 38 possibly impacted by temp criteria; 5 possibly impacted by DO criteria
 - Permitted dischargers may have increased costs with more stringent criteria
- May be a positive impact on tribal interests, recreational/commercial fisheries, jobs, water quality, water treatment costs



- Literature review



4. Amendments to Definitions Rule: "Cold water aquatic life" and "Cool water aquatic life"

Aug. 24, 2022

Background on terms

OAR 340-041-0002 (9) and (12)

"Cold water aquatic life" and "Cool water aquatic life"

- In general definitions rule (Part -0002)
- Identifies examples of fish species classified as cold or cool based on thermal tolerance
- Adopted in 2003, with temperature standard revisions



The Issue

 Terms and definitions in Part -0002 could be read as redefining the dissolved oxygen use categories in Table 21

 In a way that is inconsistent with the definitions in the dissolved oxygen rule itself.

Proposal

Revise the terms in the general definitions rule as shown:

- (9) "Cold-Water Species Aquatic Life" means aquatic organisms that are physiologically restricted to cold water including, but not limited to, native salmon, steelhead, mountain whitefish, char including bull trout, and trout.
- (12) "Cool-Water Species Aquatic Life" means aquatic organisms that are physiologically restricted to cool waters including, but not limited to, native sturgeon, Pacific lamprey, suckers, chub, sculpins and certain species of cyprinids (minnows.)

Rationale

- The definitions more accurately match terms:
 - "cold water species"
 - "cool water species"

Removes confusion with use subcategories of D.O.
OAR 340-041-0016 Table 21

 The term "cool water species" is also used in the temperature standard

Alternative considered

- Remove the terms from the general definitions rule
 - rely on the terminology in the temperature and DO standard rules
 - Define the use subcategories

Possible effects of proposed amendment

Improved clarity by removing difference in terms

 DEQ is designating waterbodies for the D.O. use subcategories in rule in this rulemaking

 The definitions in OAR 340-041-0002 are not needed in order to apply the D.O. standard
